‘What is shared about me?’

Sharing information is a crucial part of any frontline practitioners’ job when working with children, young people and their families. In this multi agency session we will explore the issues together and dispel myths around information sharing to build on good practice.

Session Outline:

- Understand our obligations both in terms of protecting information and protecting Falkirk’s vulnerable children, young people and families
- Reflect on findings from case reviews which often identify poor information sharing, resulting in missed opportunities to take actions that keep children and young people safe
- Consider good practice approaches and guides for information sharing

Learning intentions:

- To dispel confusion over what makes lawful and proportionate practice
- To support professional judgement on a day to day basis when confronted with complex situations
- To illustrate the importance of space and time to build relationships with children and families and the importance of being transparent in decision making and actions
