

Energy Best Deal

Paying for your gas and electricity can be expensive, but there are ways to cut the cost of your energy bills:

- Make sure you're getting the best energy deal for you.
- If bills are a struggle get help from suppliers or government schemes.
- Make your home more energy efficient.

Energy Best Deal can help you pay no more than you need to.

Understanding your choices

To make sure you are on the best energy deal, have you asked yourself:

- Would switching supplier(s) save me money?
- Am I on the best energy tariff, most suitable for my needs?
- Am I on the best payment option?
- Could I get a grant to improve the insulation and energy efficiency of my home?
- Could I get welfare benefits and could I get the Warm Home Discount?



Switching supplier

Changing supplier is easy and could save you hundreds, especially if you've never switched before.



The client visited a CAB as his current tariff had come to an end a and he wanted help to find a better one. The CAB adviser helped the client compare energy deals online and found a 3 year fixed deal which was cheaper than his current deal.

While switching, the adviser found out that the client had been paying too much direct debit each month and would be due a **refund**. They also found out he would be eligible for the **Warm Home Discount** with his new supplier.

The new deal saved the client a total of £158 per year. He also received a refund of £259 from his supplier and the Warm Home Discount of £140 per year.



How to switch

- 1. Find your new deal either online, or by contacting suppliers directly
- 2. Contact the supplier to agree new deal
- 3. Make sure you confirm what deal you would like, e.g. the name of the tariff

- 4. You will be sent a contract- check it's correct and the date you change supplier
- 5. Ensure you have paid all outstanding bills with your current supplier
- 6. Take a meter reading on the day you change supplier so you can check your bills





Things to think about

You will need a recent energy bill so you can see your current tariff and how much energy you've used

Do you owe any money to your current supplier?

How do you want to pay? By direct debit? Prepayment meter? Quarterly?

If you rent and you are responsible for energy bills, you can still switch

If you have a prepayment meter you can switch with a debt of up to £500.



Would you like to manage your bills online?

Do you get the Warm Home Discount with your current supplier?
