1. Welcome, Introductions and Service Updates

CB introduced herself, welcomed forum members present and advised the meeting was recorded via Zoom. Introductions were made by forum attendees, along with background on their roles and what their organisation had been focusing on during the pandemic.

CS highlighted that Neighbourhood Networks will shortly be welcoming 5 new staff, and that they have received funding to extend their services into Falkirk Central and Grangemouth

2. Review of Previous Minutes (Wednesday 27/2/2021)

The minutes were approved as an accurate record of the previous meeting, with the following updates:

- 2. "Action: CVS Falkirk team to create and share one document with food providers' organisation contact details; all providers present agreed."
 - Food providers had requested a single page format; completed and sent.
- 3.1. "Action: LH to speak with Men's Sheds about [Andy's Man Club] venue possibility."
 - Carried over to the next meeting.
- 3.2. "Action: CB to forward [ASC] details to appropriate person for adding to [mental health] leaflet."
 - As the leaflet has already been printed and distributed it cannot be changed; ASC's spring calendar is being shared alongside the leaflet,









and is scheduled for CVS Falkirk's e-bulletin and <u>Spring Forward</u> campaign.

- 5. "COVID-19 Falkirk Third Sector Response Evaluation Report": the summary report will soon be available and sent directly to forum members.
- 6.1. "Virtual Funders Fayre Recap and Funders Present": SM has sent this summary sheet to forum members via the mailing list.
- 6.2. "Action: CB to find out if groups can apply to both the Communities Recovery Fund (CRF) and now Adapt and Thrive."
 - CB confirmed groups who received funding from CRF can apply to Adapt and Thrive.
- 7.2. "Action: CB will make enquiries [re: a third sector representative for the regional group] and contact DP."
 - Carried over to the next meeting.

3. Mental Health and Wellbeing Support

HG invited members to speak on the above topic, with 4 minutes each to share their updates (per the Camerados model). Members were encouraged to share whatever they felt they needed to, whether personal, professional, or a mix of the two.

Attendees then provided updates, both personal and professional, on their recent activities. Many spoke about signs of spring (including flowers and longer days) and COVID-19 vaccines as things that gave them hope.

4. Reflections and Where We Are Now

LJ updated the members on the Falkirk Funders Fayre, which will take place virtually for 2021.

Booking is now open <u>via Eventbrite</u> for the completely free 3 day event, which takes place Tuesday 9th March – Thursday 11th March via Zoom.

CVS Falkirk knows how important funding is to local groups, especially this year, and they have adapted their normal Funders Fayre to provide an online programme of webinars with key grant funders. The Virtual Falkirk Funders Fayre will feature 3 one hour sessions each day – at 11am, 1pm and 3pm. You only need one ticket, and you can attend as many sessions as suits you.

During the event, there will be 6 leading grant funders and 3 funding-related technology companies, who will each be delivering a session. CEO, Victoria McRae will open the event at 10:45am on Tuesday.

5. Community Choices Initiative

Members discussed <u>Falkirk Council's Community Choices initiative</u>, which closes for initial expressions of interest on Friday 5th March.

Community Choices is Falkirk Council's <u>participatory budgeting</u> initiative, where members of the local communities help choose the projects which will receive funding in their area.

Members highlighted the difficulties presented by the tight timeline, with multiple concerned that this would have an impact on smaller groups and organisations and their ability to submit an application, in addition to a system which already seems to be based against them in favour of bigger (possibly national) organisations with more established profiles.









One member noted that the timescales meant groups had been given only 4 weeks out of the full year to apply for these funds. They were also worried that, instead of working with established groups, the approach would mean many people in the community would approach the funding with a mindset of, "What group can I form to do something to make use of the money, rather than it going to waste?" Other members agreed with this point.

Another highlighted that they had struggled to find information on the Falkirk Council website, and had instead passed people the CVS Falkirk link (available above) when sharing the information.

Action: SM to compile anonymised list of comment, criticisms and feedback from members to pass on to Falkirk Council.

6. AOCB

SL noted that this forum had a good format, as it ran to time and still had discussion points covered, and wondered if this was because everyone was given space to speak.

AF and 4 The Benefit of All are also working with final year psychology students from Stirling University on homeworking, and asked if members would either participate in in the survey, or pass it along to those who would be interested.

The survey aims to review the impact on people's physical and mental health while working from home since lockdown was first introduced. All questions compare home working to working in a traditional office space, and should only take 2 – 3 minutes to complete. Answers are strictly confidential and will be used for research purposes only.
