Update on Community Action Plans

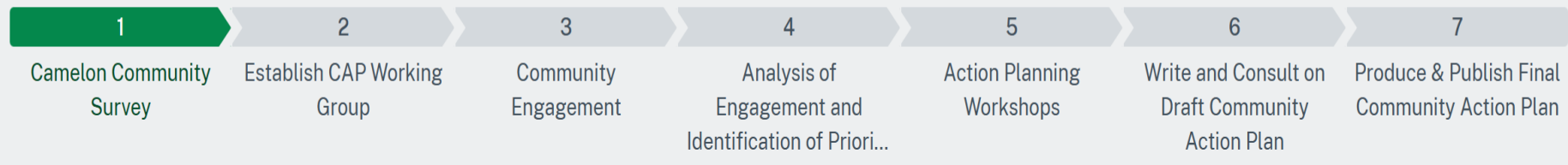
- *“A community action plan (CAP) is a participatory tool that helps community members identify and address their problems, needs and potential. It also aims to encourage community involvement and management of their environment. A community action plan can include various programs and activities that are designed to improve the quality of life and wellbeing of the community. “*
- Previous Community Action Plans (CAP) were developed for the Bainsford/Langlees, Denny/Dunipace, and Grangemouth areas.
- Now, Falkirk Community Planning Partnership (CPP) is focusing on developing CAPs for other areas including:

- **Camelon area:** Engagement activities already underway – starting with a Halloween themed community event on 30th October 2023 – and **Camelon Community Survey**, which runs online from **16 October – 30 November 23**.
- The survey asks for the views from Camelon residents about what they like and do not like about the area and what they'd like to change.

Update on Community Action Plans

- Camelon CAP **does not** include Tamfourhill area.

- It is proposed that the next communities to be invited to participate in creation of a CAP will be **Redding and Slamannan**.
- It is intended that the 3 CAPs will be developed/published sequentially over a 3-year period*.
- **A caveat that this is proposed activity, and a full review of the Falkirk Plan will occur during this period so plans may be subject to change.*
